Blood Donation Camp

Organized at Government College Sangraha
21 November 2025



The Shaheed Bhagat Singh National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Government College Sangraha jointly organized a Blood Donation Camp on **21 November 2025**. The event was conducted in collaboration with **Civil Hospital Nahan** and the **Blood Bank, Nahan**, as part of the institution's commitment to community welfare, public health promotion, and social outreach. The primary purpose of the camp was to encourage voluntary blood donation, sensitize the community about its significance, and promote a culture of humanitarian service among students and faculty.

A fully equipped medical team from Civil Hospital Nahan, led by **Dr. Nishi**, supervised the entire procedure. The team ensured compliance with standard medical protocols, donor safety

measures, and proper handling of collected blood units. The professional guidance provided by the medical staff strengthened public confidence and helped address health-related apprehensions among first-time donors.



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The NSS Unit of Government College Sangraha played a critical role in planning and executing the programme. The volunteers undertook responsibilities including venue setup, donor registration, medical screening assistance, donor guidance, arrangement of rest and refreshment areas, and overall management of crowd flow. Their dedication and timely coordination ensured the smooth and efficient conduct of the camp.

In the **fifteen days leading up to the event**, NSS volunteers carried out a series of sensitization and awareness activities across Sangraha and nearby localities. These included rallies, public announcements, distribution of informative pamphlets, and door-to-door campaigns aimed at motivating people to donate blood. The awareness drives highlighted the health benefits of blood donation, its role in emergency medical care, and the minimal risks associated with the procedure. These efforts substantially reduced public hesitation and encouraged wider participation in the camp.

The programme received an overwhelming response, with **approximately 100 individuals donating blood**. The donor group comprised college students, teaching and non-teaching staff,



employees from various government departments, local residents, members of the Ex-Servicemen Association, and active participants from Mahila Mandal and Nvyuvak Mandal Sangraha. The broad community involvement reflected a strong sense of collective responsibility and highlighted the success of the awareness initiatives undertaken by the college.

The **Ex-Servicemen Association, Sangraha**, extended generous support by providing refreshments to all donors, volunteers, and

medical staff. Their contribution added community warmth to the event and underscored the spirit of cooperation central to such public welfare drives.
