



2.7.i: Gender Equity

Government College Sangrah consistently promotes gender equity by organizing a wide range of meaningful activities throughout the academic year. The institution has an active **Redressal and Grievance Cell** that ensures the timely resolution of students' concerns with transparency and sensitivity. Various programmes such as **emergency service training**, **mental health awareness activities**, and **health-related sessions** are regularly conducted for the overall well-being of students. The college has also established an **Internal Complaint Committee (ICC)** under the **POSH guidelines** to prevent sexual harassment and to promote a safe and respectful campus environment. This committee frequently conducts awareness workshops, interactive sessions, and sensitization drives to educate students about their rights and responsibilities. These initiatives collectively aim to create an atmosphere of equality, safety, and inclusiveness. Faculty members and NSS volunteers play an active role in coordinating these events. Students participate with enthusiasm, reflecting a growing culture of respect and mutual understanding. Through these sustained efforts, Government College Sangrah continues to strengthen its commitment to gender justice and student empowerment.

1. Fire Brigade Training

On July 14, 2024, Government College Sangrah hosted an emergency services training session for its NSS volunteers, focusing on essential skills for responding to fire incidents and road accidents. A dedicated team of emergency service professionals conducted the training, imparting crucial knowledge and practical techniques to the 15 participating NSS volunteers. The session commenced with an overview of fire safety protocols, emphasizing preventive measures and the proper use of fire extinguishers. Volunteers were instructed on how to assess fire situations, evacuate safely, and administer basic first aid for burn injuries.

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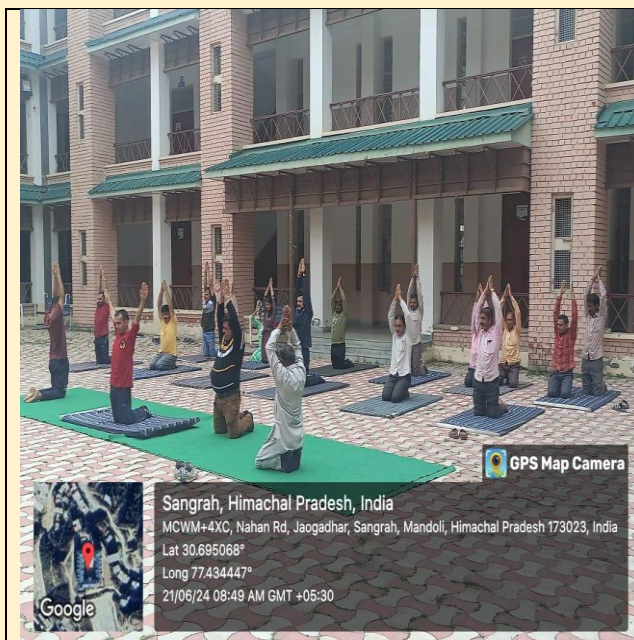
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3. Anti-Drug and HIV-AIDS awareness

On 30th November, 2024, during the NSS camp's evening session, a vital slogan writing competition focused on HIV-AIDS awareness



took place. Eight participants, (Muskan Sharma, Sonika, Vishali,



Babita, Tamanna, Nitin, Randeep and Nitisha) representing all four NSS unit houses, engaged in the event. The competition aimed to raise awareness about the disease and promote prevention through concise and impactful slogans. Volunteers demonstrated their creativity and understanding of the issue, crafting messages intended to educate and inspire. The event highlighted the NSS's commitment to addressing critical health concerns and fostering community awareness among its members. The competition served as a platform for volunteers to contribute meaningfully to public health education.

4. Rabies and other zoonotic diseases: During the National Service Scheme (NSS) camp organized at Government College Sangrah on 2ND December, 2024, an important educational session was conducted from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM. Dr. Sanjay Kumar from the Animal Husbandry Department was specially invited to this session, where he provided detailed information on rabies and other zoonotic diseases. Dr. Sanjay Kumar highlighted the symptoms, prevention, and precautions related to rabies. He explained that rabies is a fatal viral disease, usually transmitted through the bite of an infected animal, especially dogs. Symptoms include headache, fever, restlessness, fear of water (hydrophobia), and ultimately paralysis. He emphasized that timely vaccination and vigilance can prevent this disease.



5. Emergency First Aid and Critical Health Issues

The afternoon session of the NSS camp at Government College Sangrah, an academic session organized for volunteers at 2:00 PM in Room No. 304. A total of 52 volunteers participated in this session, where the keynote speaker, Mr. Chaman Lal Soni,



Block Medical Educator from the BMO Office, delivered a highly informative lecture on emergency first aid and critical health issues. He explained in detail the practical methods for treating injured individuals in emergency situations such as road accidents and earthquakes. Mr. Soni elaborated on essential first-aid techniques, emphasizing the importance of immediate response during medical emergencies

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Report on One Billion Rising Campaign –
Government College Sangrah

The NSS Unit of Government College Sangrah successfully organized the *One Billion Rising Campaign*, a global movement devoted to ending violence against women and promoting gender equality. The event aimed to create awareness among students about the rising concerns of gender-based violence and the need for collective responsibility in building a safe and sensitive society. The campaign brought together students, faculty members, and volunteers to



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stand in solidarity with millions of people around the world who are committed to ensuring dignity, justice, and equal rights for women. The programme was marked by thoughtful discussions, expressive activities, and inspirational messages delivered by the college leadership.

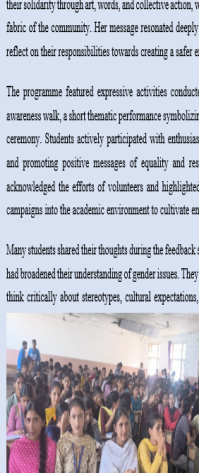
Principal Dr. Meenu Bhaskar Jivran, the keynote speaker of the programme, addressed the gathering with an insightful and powerful speech. She emphasized that gender-based violence is not merely a social issue but a deep-rooted structural problem that requires continuous awareness, education, and community engagement. Dr. Jivran highlighted that true empowerment begins with recognizing the value and potential of every woman, irrespective of her economic, social, or cultural background.

She encouraged students to become active participants in fostering equality, stating that young people hold the power to challenge harmful norms and reshape society through informed actions. Her speech drew attention to the need for empathy, respect, and responsible behaviour in everyday interactions.

One of the most important points in Dr. Jivran's address was the significance of *gender sensitization* within educational institutions. She explained that colleges have a crucial role in developing informed, sensitive, and socially aware citizens who can contribute to eradicating discrimination and violence. She also stressed on the importance of bystander intervention, explaining that silence often becomes a form of acceptance. Students must speak up, report abuse, and support victims whenever they encounter any form of injustice. Dr. Jivran also



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pointed out that initiatives like One Billion Rising give young people a platform to express their solidarity through art, words, and collective action, which ultimately strengthens the social fabric of the community. Her message resonated deeply with the audience, inspiring them to reflect on their responsibilities towards creating a safer environment for women.

The programme featured expressive activities conducted by NSS volunteers, including an awareness walk, a short thematic performance symbolizing resistance to violence, and a pledge ceremony. Students actively participated with enthusiasm, holding banners, raising slogans, and promoting positive messages of equality and respect. The NSS Programme Officer acknowledged the efforts of volunteers and highlighted the importance of integrating such campaigns into the academic environment to cultivate empathy and social responsibility.

Many students shared their thoughts during the feedback session, expressing how the campaign had broadened their understanding of gender issues. They mentioned that the event helped them think critically about stereotypes, cultural expectations, and the role of youth in preventing



gender-based violence. Some students commented that Dr. Jivran's speech motivated them to be more conscious of the language, behaviour, and attitudes they use in daily life. Others appreciated the opportunity to participate in activities that allowed them to stand for a global cause. Overall, the student feedback reflected a positive and thoughtful response, showing that the campaign succeeded in generating awareness, self-reflection, and a sense of collective commitment.

The One Billion Rising Campaign at Government College Sangrah thus proved to be an impactful and meaningful initiative. The leadership of Principal Dr. Meenu Bhaskar Jivran, along with the dedicated efforts of the NSS Unit, played a central role in making the programme educational, inspiring, and socially relevant. 2. **Accessibility and Support Services:** Ensure campus infrastructure, learning resources, and digital platforms are fully accessible to students with disabilities and facilitate the provision of assistive technologies, mobility aids, and other necessary accommodations.
3. **Academic Support and Development:** Provide academic assistance through tailored programs, such as extra coaching, accessible learning materials, and extended deadlines when needed and Collaborate with faculty to develop inclusive teaching methodologies and assessment practices.
4. **Skill Enhancement and Career Guidance:** Organize workshops, training programs, and internships to enhance skills and prepare students for future careers and partner with placement cells to identify inclusive job opportunities and support the transition from college to the workforce.
5. **Mentorship and Peer Support:** Establish a mentorship program to connect students with disabilities with experienced mentors or alumni for guidance and motivation and Create peer support groups to foster mutual encouragement and collaboration.
6. **Leadership Opportunities, Co-Curricular and Extracurricular:** Creating opportunities for leadership, co-curricular, and extracurricular development for individuals with physical disabilities requires an inclusive and adaptive approach. Encourage active participation in sports, cultural events, and leadership roles to build confidence and interpersonal skills and recognize and celebrate achievements through awards and honors.
7. **Counseling and Emotional Support:** Provide access to mental health counseling and emotional support tailored to the needs of students with disabilities and organize regular wellness programs to ensure holistic well-being.



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8. **Policy and Feedback Mechanism:** Develop and enforce college policies that safeguard the rights and interests of students with disabilities and establish a feedback mechanism to address concerns and continuously improve the committee's initiatives.

8. Gender Champions Committee

Mission: To actively promote gender equality across all facets of college life, including academic, social, and extracurricular activities.

- To provide resources, support, and advocacy for gender equality and prevent all forms of gender-based violence and discrimination.
- To foster a culture where individuals of all genders feel safe, respected, and able to freely express their identities.



Core Objectives

1. **Awareness and Education:** Organize workshops, seminars, and discussions on gender equality, women's empowerment, and LGBTQ+ inclusion and provide training on topics such as consent, respectful behavior, and gender stereotypes for students, faculty, and staff.
2. **Promote Equal Opportunities:** Ensure equal opportunities for all genders in academic programs, leadership roles, scholarships, and career placements and advocate for policies that promote gender diversity in all departments and activities.
3. **Gender Safety and Anti-Harassment:** Promote a zero-tolerance policy for gender-based violence, sexual harassment, and bullying and create safe reporting mechanisms and support systems for those affected by gender-based violence.
4. **Support Systems for Gender Minorities:** Establish dedicated support channels for LGBTQ+ students, faculty, and staff, ensuring inclusivity and sensitivity and develop resources such as counseling and peer networks for marginalized gender groups.

- **Administrative Staff Member:** To assist with documentation and implementation of policies.



- **Legal/Social Expert (if possible):** To provide legal awareness and guidance on rights and policies.

Purposes of the Committee

- **Protection of Rights:** Ensures that SC/ST students are treated fairly and do not face discrimination in academics, hostel facilities, placements, or extracurricular activities.
- **Grievance Redressal:** Provides a structured mechanism to address complaints related to caste-based discrimination or harassment.
- **Educational & Financial Support:** Assists students in availing scholarships, financial aid, and government schemes.
- **Awareness & Sensitization:** Conducts seminars, workshops, and awareness programs on legal rights, career opportunities, and available welfare schemes.
- **Monitoring & Compliance:** Ensures that the college follows government policies and UGC guidelines regarding SC/ST welfare.

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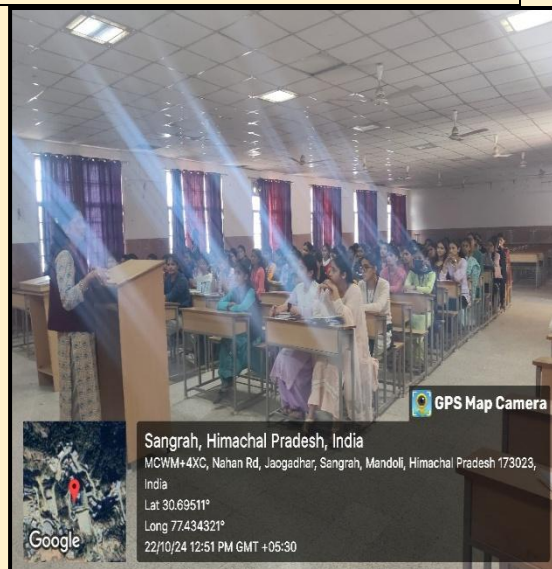
