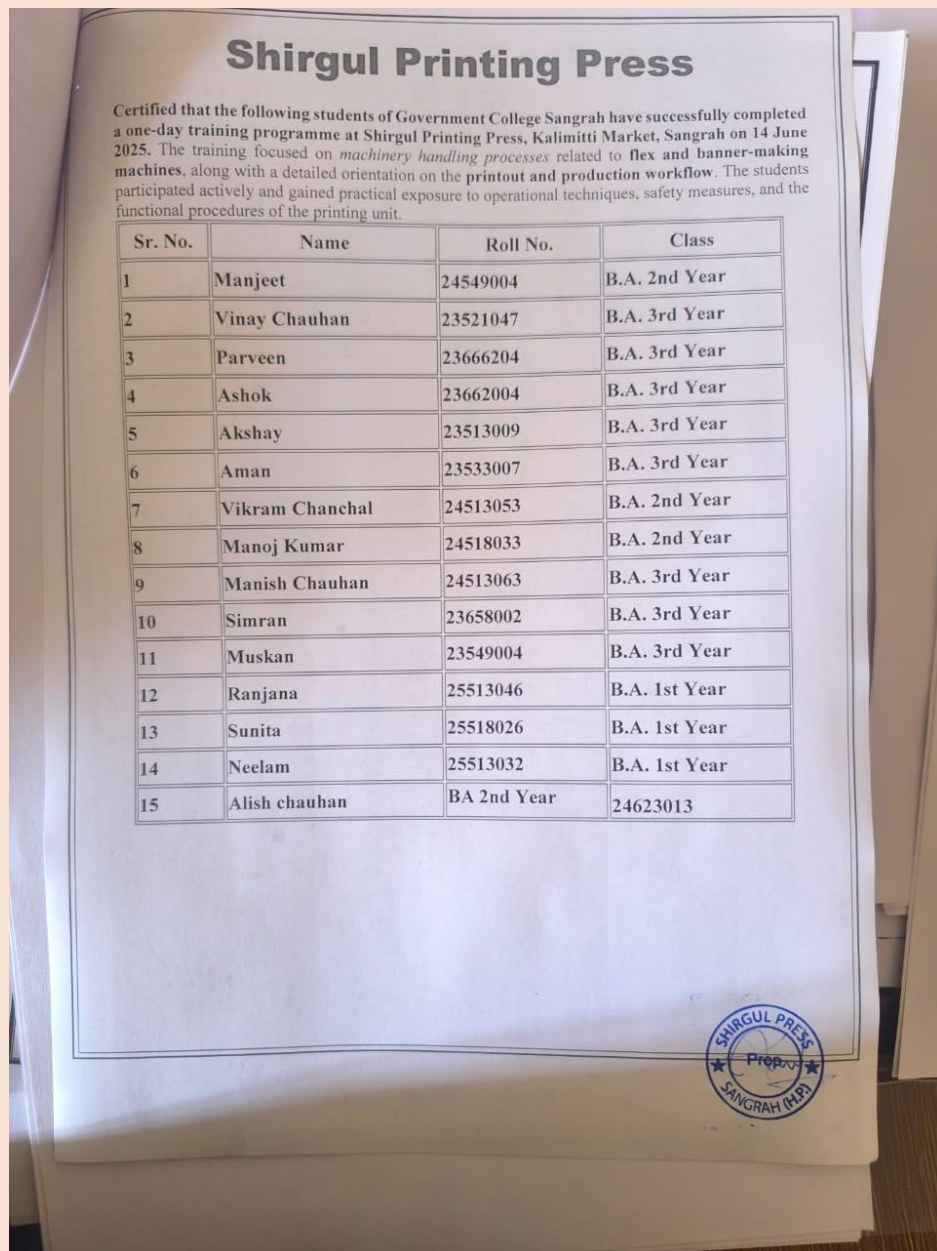

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One-Day Training Programme on Digital Literacy & Computer Literacy

Organized by: IQAC & NSS Unit, Government College Sangrah

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in collaboration with the NSS Unit of Government College Sangrah successfully conducted a one-day hands-on training programme on *Digital Literacy and Computer Literacy* for the students of the college on dated 14th June, 2025. The training was organized under the capacity-building and skill-development initiatives of the institution. A total of 09 students participated in this programme, which aimed to impart practical knowledge regarding essential digital operations and workplace-relevant machine handling skills.



The programme was conducted in association with Shri Kamal Sharma, a well-known entrepreneur of Sangrah, who possesses long-standing experience in digital services, printing technology, document processing and small-scale digital business operations. His expertise provided students with real-time exposure to the functioning of digital equipment and the technical aspects involved in printing, photocopying, and digital design support.

The session began with a brief introduction by the NSS Programme Officer, who highlighted the objective of the training—to enhance students' digital competency, improve their workplace readiness, and provide them with practical skills that are essential for modern employment sectors. The importance of computer literacy in a rapidly digitizing world was



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emphasized, along with the need for students to learn the operational mechanisms of everyday digital machines used in professional settings.

During the training, Shri Kamal Sharma provided detailed demonstrations on the functioning of various digital machines. Students learned how a **printing machine operates**, including cartridge settings, ink management, paper alignment, print quality adjustment, and error-handling techniques. They were trained in the **photocopy (photostat) process**, where they gained step-by-step understanding of document placement, resizing, brightness control, paper feeding, and troubleshooting common photocopy issues.



Participants were further introduced to the basics of **paper selection**, including types of paper, GSM standards, quality differences, and professional suitability for different tasks such as printing, photocopying, and colour outputs. This segment helped students understand the importance of choosing the correct paper in commercial printing processes.

A major highlight of the training was the exposure to **flex and banner printing machine mechanisms**. Students were given a live demonstration of how banner machines operate, how designs are processed into printable formats, how colour calibration works, and how large-size printed materials are

prepared for final output. This experience offered valuable insights into digital printing business operations and opened up awareness for self-employment possibilities.

Students actively participated, asked questions, and practiced certain machine-handling steps under the guidance of the trainer. They expressed that the training was extremely useful, especially for those planning to work in offices, digital service centres, media-related activities or small-scale entrepreneurial ventures. The hands-on nature of the programme helped them gain confidence, practical understanding, and real-world exposure beyond classroom teaching.

The programme concluded with a brief feedback session in which students shared their learning experiences. The IQAC Coordinator thanked Shri Kamal Sharma for his valuable contribution and appreciated the efforts of the NSS Unit for coordinating the event. He further emphasized that IQAC will continue to organize such skill-enhancing programmes to strengthen the employability and digital readiness of the students.

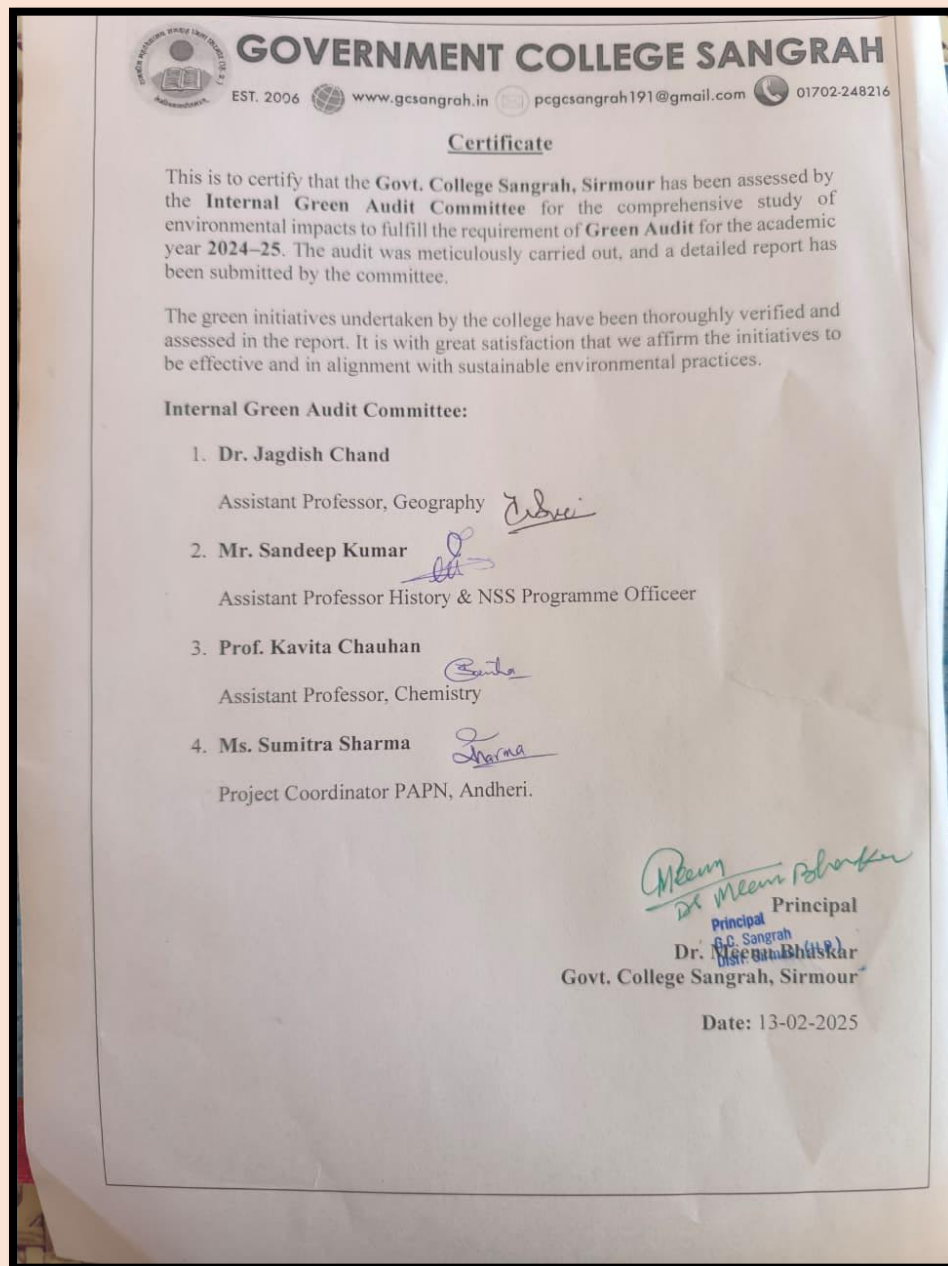

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E. One Day Workshop on Financial Literacy



One-Day Workshop on Financial Literacy

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in collaboration with the NSS Unit of Government College Sangraha organized a one-day workshop on "Financial Literacy for College Students" on 31st December 2024. The main objective of the workshop was to create awareness among the students about the importance of financial planning, responsible money management, banking processes, investment options, and the significance of financial discipline in a rapidly developing digital economy. The event was a part of the college's continuous efforts to enhance students' life skills, employability skills, and financial awareness under quality enhancement initiatives. The workshop commenced with a brief introductory session conducted by the NSS Programme Officer, who welcomed the dignitaries, resource persons, faculty members, and students. He highlighted the increasing importance of financial knowledge in the life of youth and emphasized that financial literacy is now considered an essential component of holistic education. The Principal of the college addressed the gathering and appreciated the initiative taken by IQAC and NSS for conducting this meaningful academic activity. 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One-Day Training Programme on Digital Literacy & Computer Literacy

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in collaboration with the NSS Unit of Government College Sangrah successfully conducted a one-day hands-on training programme on *Digital Literacy and Computer Literacy* for the students of the college on dated 14th June, 2025. The training was organized under the capacity-building and skill-development initiatives of the institution. A total of 09 students participated in this programme, which aimed to impart practical knowledge regarding essential digital operations and workplace-relevant machine handling skills.



The programme was conducted in association with Shri Kamal Sharma, a well-known entrepreneur of Sangrah, who possesses long-standing experience in digital services, printing technology, document processing and small-scale digital business operations. His expertise provided students with real-time exposure to the functioning of digital equipment and the technical aspects involved in printing, photocopying, and digital design support.

The session began with a brief introduction by the NSS Programme Officer, who highlighted the objective of the training—to enhance students' digital competency, improve their workplace readiness, and provide them with practical skills that are essential for modern employment sectors. The importance of computer literacy in a rapidly digitizing world was



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emphasized, along with the need for students to learn the operational mechanisms of everyday digital machines used in professional settings.

During the training, Shri Kamal Sharma provided detailed demonstrations on the functioning of various digital machines. Students learned how a **printing machine operates**, including cartridge settings, ink management, paper alignment, print quality adjustment, and error-handling techniques. They were trained in the **photocopy (photostat) process**, where they gained step-by-step understanding of document placement, resizing, brightness control, paper feeding, and troubleshooting common photocopy issues.



Participants were further introduced to the basics of **paper selection**, including types of paper, GSM standards, quality differences, and professional suitability for different tasks such as printing, photocopying, and colour outputs. This segment helped students understand the importance of choosing the correct paper in commercial printing processes.

A major highlight of the training was the exposure to **flex and banner printing machine mechanisms**. Students were given a live demonstration of how banner machines operate, how designs are processed into printable formats, how colour calibration works, and how large-size printed materials are

prepared for final output. This experience offered valuable insights into digital printing business operations and opened up awareness for self-employment possibilities.

Students actively participated, asked questions, and practiced certain machine-handling steps under the guidance of the trainer. They expressed that the training was extremely useful, especially for those planning to work in offices, digital service centres, media-related activities or small-scale entrepreneurial ventures. The hands-on nature of the programme helped them gain confidence, practical understanding, and real-world exposure beyond classroom teaching.

The programme concluded with a brief feedback session in which students shared their learning experiences. The IQAC Coordinator thanked Shri Kamal Sharma for his valuable contribution and appreciated the efforts of the NSS Unit for coordinating the event. He further emphasized that IQAC will continue to organize such skill-enhancing programmes to strengthen the employability and digital readiness of the students.



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Development of Course Contents for MOOCs
